MAIN COMMITTEE MEMBER

The roles of a Committee Member are to; contribute to the making of club policy; actively participate in running the club in accordance with its rules and regulations and to help promote active membership.

They will:

- assess the general attitudes and views of Club Members by talking with them while in the huts, on meets and at other functions and represent a consensus view in Main Committee
- act as policy maker for the Club
- share the ideas and promote the activities of the committee to the Membership
- maintain a personal interest in attracting new Members of appropriate calibre through the promotion of the principles of the club and encouraging participation of club activities
- take responsibility, as requested by the Main Committee, for specific tasks such as dinners, handbook production, BMC representation, working group membership etc.
- assume responsibility when in huts to ensure that behaviour is acceptable and that rules are observed
- attend as many meetings as possible, if unable to attend present their apologies to the Honorary Secretary as soon as possible
- prepare for each meeting by reading the relevant papers in advance and fully participate in those meetings
- where possible attend at least two club meets (including a maintenance meet), one aspirants meet and one dinner each year
- regularly check the main committee forum, contribute to discussions and participate in all forum based votes

Hand over

Every committee member who takes on an additional responsibility will develop a "hand over pack" to pass on to their successor. The purpose of the pack is to help their successor settle into their new role as smoothly as possible.

These responsibilities are also relevant to all Club Officers and Officials who are members of the main Committee
